## Around the View





Earlier this year, our superintendent, Gordon Seliga, was able to acquire a lift which allows him to work on the trees on the golf course in safety. We're sure you've seen it around the course! By having this piece of equipment, he is able to do these projects in house and, ultimately save us money.

Tree management, including tree pruning, is an essential part of quality golf course turf management. Gordon has been actively going through the golf course and finding areas in the trees that need to be pruned. The majority of the work has been in removing dead branches. A significant benefit of this process is that it will save on the cleanup needed in the early spring. Another important benefit is the overall health of the tree. Dead branches increase the risk of disease. Removing the dead branches also helps strengthen the tree overall. Water and nutrients wasted on dead or dying parts of the tree are now able to be more efficiently used by the healthy part of the tree.

Gordon informed me that the trees at Lake View have never been properly pruned. It is a project he has wanted to tackle for years. Raising the canopy of the trees is also important for proper airflow on the golf course and to ensure enough sunlight is getting to the turf. The result is better quality turf and a healthier golf course. The aesthetics of raising the canopy is obvious. Next time you're driving up to the course take a moment to look out at the landscape. It's much easier to see more of our beautiful golf course.

There's plenty of wonderful golf weather left this season. Please enjoy your club and thanks for being members. We all love this place!

### **RULES QUESTION** ·

What is the penalty for teeing off in front of the tee markers?

**ANSWER:** There are two answers: In stroke play, the player is penalized two strokes and he must correct his error and play from the correct set of tees.

In match play, there is no penalty, however, his opponent has the option to keep the ball in play or require the player to re-tee correctly from behind the markers.
