Hello Members,


Fall is upon us with beautiful clear views of the lake.



From the Greens and Grounds

Roots Grow in Air




Gordon Seliga is a Certified Golf Course Superintendent and is a wealth of knowledge. One of the first things I learned from him is that roots grow in air.

One September, after enjoying a summer of playing golf on pristine greens, I grumbled to him about having to endure the end of season aeration process.

No one likes putting on plinko greens. A perfectly stroked putt hops, skips and jumps off your intended line exasperating you once again. Golf is hard enough, right? The fact of the matter is that those pristine greens don't just happen. It takes a lot to keep the putting surfaces healthy. One of the most critical elements of maintenance of the turf is the aerification process. Aeration controls organic matter – i.e., decaying roots and grass stems – relieves soil compaction, stimulates root growth, and improves drainage. Excessive organic matter acts like a sponge, holding water close to the surface, inhibiting root growth, and fostering disease and turf failure.

Top dressing with sand fills the holes from the process giving roots space, and air, to grow. Top dressing also smooths out the small imperfections in the greens, leading to smoother, truer surfaces.

Timing is very important for this process to be successful. It has to be done when growing conditions are optimal to ensure speedy recovery. In recent years Gordon has been using a medium sized tine to punch our greens. Immediately after the process, the mower heights have to be raised to allow for



proper growth, resulting in temporarily slower greens. Once the turf recovers and the aeration holes fill in we'll be back to playing on the best greens around.
